Jimmy Chambers wins Ball Striker 2013 club championship

Jimmy Chambers showed up ready to play. When that happens the results are predictable. Chambers takes 1st place. The Ball Striker gross club championship at Architects was no exception. With rounds of 80 and 81 (161) Chambers edged Mel Knight by 4 strokes.

Darryl Jeffries recovered from an opening round 89 with a 2nd round 82 to take 3rd place. Last year's club champ, Greg Ward, also put himself out of contention with an opening round 92 but recovered with a 2nd round 84 to take 4th

place. Garrick Bell rounded out the top 5 with a respectable 89/88/177.

Mel Knight won the flight A net club championship competition with a net 147 for his two rounds. Darryl Jeffries took second place in flight A with a net 153(the gross club champ is not eligible for net flight honors).

Garrick Bell out played all other flight B competitors with a net 149, 9 strokes clear of the rest of the field. Tom Culp took second place in flight B with a net 158. Donald Rucker edged George

Weekes by 2 strokes for flight C honors with a net 156.

George Gresham and Cleve Eatman both recorded 2 round net scores of 162 to top D flight. Gresham nailed down 1st place by winning the 1st tiebreaker (lowest 2nd round net score).

Congratulations to all of the club championship competition winners. Everyone involved enjoyed 2 days of great weather on a great golf course.

Mel Knight is double Cup champ at Architects

Mel Knight brought his "A" game for round 1 and round 2 of the Ball Striker Club Championship event. The result was a 1st place finish for round 1 and a T1 finish for round 2. In doing so Knight collected 72 Shippen Cup points and moved ahead of Jimmy Chambers to take the lead in the overall Cup competition. Knight has owned the number one spot for most of the season and with 3 Shippen Cup events remaining, he is the odds on favorite to become the 2013 Shippen Cup champ.

Jimmy Chambers may have something to say about that. Chambers collected 48 points over the championship weekend and is only 20 points behind Knight. Donald Rucker and Keith Kirkland, who each scored 30 weekend points, remain within striking distance of the championship should the top 2 stumble.

Last year's Shippen Cup runner up, Darryl Jeffries, shook off a mediocre T8 (20 points) for round 1 and placed T1 (32 points) for round 2. Jeffries ranked number 2 for total event points with 52. Garrick Bell placed T2 (28 points) in round 1 and 4th (20 points) in round 2 to collect 48 weekend points.

Greg Ward recovered from a round 1 11th place finish (10 points) with a round 2 T1 (32 points). George Weekes with T8's in round 1 and 2 banked 40 Shippen Cup points and moved up to 5th place in the overall Cup standings.

Cleve Eatman, Tom Culp, George Thomas, Mel LuSane, George Gresham and Curtis Atkinson all scored 30 points for the weekend.

The last 3 Ball Striker events of this season are all Shippen Cup events that will feature individual match play (mano a mano) and stroke play against the field. Skyview September 28, The Garrison October 12 and Galloping Hill October 26. These events promise an exciting end to a fun and competitive Shippen Cup season.

I was impressed with the organization of the event. The fellowship among golfers from around the world was impressive. Golfers are a fraternity and this was evident at this event.

To excel in this event you must be ready to play; mentally and physically. You are immersed in a professional tour type atmosphere throughout the week. It was exciting and eventful. After a great round 1 (gross 76/net 66) I was almost late for my round 2 start time. This contributed to a poor job of course management which was reflected in my round 2 score (gross 91/net 81). I look forward to testing my skills at future WAHC events. My experience at this year's event will help me better prepare to be ready to play and hopefully play well.

I encourage all Ball Strikers to consider participating in this world class event. It is sure to take your game to the next level.
















On August 20, 1984 the Cold War was still raging, the cost of gas was \$1.21 per gallon, and a hearty group of golfers took a leap of faith that continues to resonate.

More than 680 golfers converged on Myrtle Beach in 1984 for the first World Amateur Handicap Championship, just weeks after Mary Lou Retton vaulted to Olympic fame. At the time, Myrtle Beach wasn't the golf Mecca it is today. The area was home to just 40 golf courses and a still-being-defined national reputation.

That first year players and, quite frankly, organizers hardly knew what to expect. The event had no history to sell, relying instead on the dream of allowing "regular" amateur golfers the opportunity to compete under PGA Tour-like conditions.


The early years were a learning experience for

everyone – the 11 hearty souls that have played in every tournament still talk about being served barbeque and baked beans on flimsy plates – but people loved the event.

The tournament quickly expanded from 54 to 72 holes and the participant count rose faster than the Space Shuttle Discovery, which enjoyed its maiden voyage one week after the inaugural event concluded.

The World Championship Playoff was added in 1988, and the event earned its spot on the golf calendar, due in no small part to its inclusiveness.

The tournament has always been open to all men and women, and the game's most rigorously enforced handicap system has provided a level playing field for everyone. Handicaps as low as three and as high as



34 have claimed the mantle of World Champion and five women, including three in the last six years, have been crowned champ.

While competition remains at the event's core – it is a tournament after all - it's only half of its appeal. What has long made the World Am special is the camaraderie it fosters among participants.

The World's Largest 19th Hole, which consumes 120,000-square-feet of the Myrtle Beach Convention Center, is the event's nightly pulse. Live music, free food and drink, nightly leaderboards, and a golf expo have drawn golfers like Vijay Singh to the range.

The World Am has proudly worn the "Everyman's U.S. Open" moniker, but it has attracted the rich and famous as well. Over the years, David Feherty and Annika

Sorenstam, among others, have entertained participants at the 19th Hole with stories from inside the game. Major League Baseball legend Roger Clemens, former World Series hero Tony Womack, and NBA champion Wes Matthews are among the professional athletes who have participated.

Over the past 30 years, the event has changed immensely. It will take more than 60 Myrtle Beach golf courses to accommodate the 3,300 participants this year, scoring is now automated, food is served by some of the area's best restaurants, and the tournament has improved in nearly every measurable way.

While so much has changed since the first tee shot was struck in 1984, the World Am's bedrock qualities – golf and good times - have remained unchanged.
